***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH** Nicene Creed
(Ecumenical)

We believe in one God, the Creator, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Creator; through whom all things were made.
